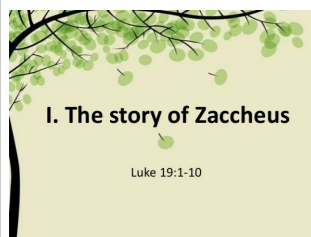

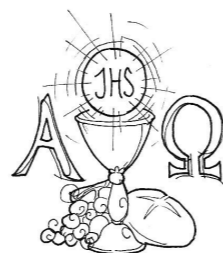

Faith and Light Fiesta will be held on Sunday 10th November at 3pm in St. Ronan's Parish Centre. All welcome.

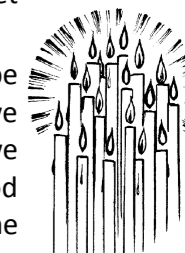
