Parish Mission Legacies

Canon Jimmy asked Fodhla for her thoughts following the Mission - these were sent and a follow-up meeting has been arranged

Observations from Parish Mission, September 2019

- 1. Hunger to deepen prayer life and to have a more meaningful relationship with God
- 2. Prevalence of suicide. Need for intervention, prayer and healing
- 3. Gift of music in the parish: great asset and gateway to other people and God
- 4. Opportunity to grow leaders: to encourage, equip and release parishioners to serve in their giftings. Tremendous interest and involvement shown by community
- 5. Openness shown by leadership of parish
- 6. Desire to invest in people of the parish and their faith formation

Music: Children's Choir to be set-up in St. Ronan's and St. Mary's Primary Schools Youth choir to be set up within St. Kevin's: being organised by Paul Flynn and Karen McElroy

Faith Formation: look into courses to attend, and/or people to bring in to speak within the Parish

How had the Mission momentum been going since?

- St. Mary's: congregation not taking the Parish Mission booklets
- Suggestion made that Altar Servers will give out books before Mass
- Screens will be used in Holy Cross
- Tea at morning Mass Paul Flynn will organise a committee to get this up and running
- Theme Masses any further thoughts?
 - Themes in relation to time of year relative to the Church calendar

- Start in January new theme each month
