The deep cleaning and sanifizing of Holy Cross this week has been sponsored anonymously.

As promised a few weeks ago, as a Pastoral Team/Covid Committee, we have now reviewed our schedule of weekend Mases within the Parish. As numbers attending both Masses remain small, we have now decided to move the Vigil Mass to St. Mary's at 6pm and to retain the 11am Mass in Holy Cross. The Friday night Mass in St. Mary's will now become a Lay Led Liturgy, beginning at 7pm, preceded by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 5.30pm.

Booking for both weekend Masses can now be done in one of three ways. 1. By phoning the Parish Office during office hours to book a place (028 67721088). 2. By emailing the Parish Office to Book your seat (fermanaghparishes@gmail.com) or 3. By going to the office to book your place. Tickets are **no longer required.** 

Spaces continue to be limited in both Churches, 90 in Holy Cross and 60 in St. Mary's. These changes in the schedule will begin on the weekend of 3rd/4th October and will remain in place until Christmas time, when a review will take place again.

We would also encourage the booking of anniversary masses to 3 at weekend masses and encourage only family members to attend these, so that others can be accommodated.

Conscious of the increase in the virus we have also decided to limit those attending a funeral mass in Holy Cross to 60 and in St. Mary's to 40. Only family members are allowed to enter the cemetery for the burial. All others attending outside are to adhere to the 2 metre social distancing. Again all of these arrangments are to ensure the safety of all.

Baptisms are now to have only the parents and Godparents and baby attend.

For all those attending our daily masses, we will now require that you give your name and contact number for the first few weeks so that we have a data base to check you in after that time.

Going forward into the winter, to ensure ventilation in Church, the main doors of both churches will be kept open.

We apologize if all this seems draconian or severe but it is our responsibility to keep all our people safe during this pandemic time.

We thank you for your co-operation as we all strive to live and deal with these unknown times.
