# The deep cleaning and sanifizing of Holy Cross this week has been sponsored by John and Philomena Hanna.

We are now into our third week of re-opening, around 10% of our pre-covid congregation has returned to date. Many are still afraid and apprehensive, and many are happy to stay within their own homes and join us on-line. The weekday masses in particular have seen on average, depending on the number of anniversaries, around half of our present capacity attend, the weekend masses have witnessed very similar congregation sizes.

The rota for all ministries will be due to be renewed at the end of the month within our Parish, and with all the advice now given at Diocesan level, from the experience and advice from other parishes throughout our Diocese, and neighboring Diocese, I have decided to amend the present schedule of masses, beginning Monday <u>3rd August</u>, with the proviso of reviewing it again in two months time, that is at the end of September.

### The New Schedule:

Weekday: Lay Led Liturgy on Monday at 10am in Holy Cross. St. Peregrine Mass to return to Holy Cross on Tuesday at 7pm. Wednesday and Thursday morning 10am Mass in Holy Cross. Friday 7pm Mass in St. Mary's, preceded by Exposition at 5.30pm.

Weekend: 6pm Vigil in Holy Cross. 11am Sunday in Holy Cross.

With this new schedule there is a greater capacity for numbers to attend, and to avail of the weekday masses to fulfil their Sunday obligation. We would also encourage you to book your anniversary masses during the week day masses to balance out the weekend attendance.

I hope you are all happy with this new arrangement, it is essential that we respond to the new norm and continue to provide a public service to those who require it, but also to think more and plan more ahead for our new virtual congregation on line.

Whenever a funeral occurs, it will be celebrated at 11am in either Holy Cross or St. Mary's, the 10am in Holy Cross will be cancelled. Any mass intention will be included in the Funeral Mass. Again, because of our limited spaces in Church (76 in Holy Cross and 40 in St. Mary's), and because people book their weekend mass earlier in the week, and out of respect for the bereaved, there will be NO Sunday Funeral Masses in the Parish of Aghalurcher.
