Each person who enters our churches during this pandemic enters with the attitude of an unchurched person: unsure about how to act, intimidated perhaps, and fearful of being judged for doing the wrong thing. Easing all these fears is a priority for our local Parish Covid Committee. Keeping you our Parishioners safe as possible is also our aim. That is why we ask you to wear a face covering before you enter our buildings. The ideal face covering is a mask, worn over the mouth and nose. If a mask is not possible, a face-shield is essential, even though this is not as good a barrier against virus spread, so a mask is preferable. Infection spread is further reduced by good airflow in the Church, that is why we keep the back doors open during mass. This may become an issue as the days grow colder, and so appropriate clothing may be necessary. Family groups attending mass, and those who live in one house or 'bubble' can sit together, as couples can too, two couples at either end of the seat is also possible. All of this enables us to maximise our numbers in Church, observing our 2 meter social distancing. Observing all of these guidelines helps us to keep you safe, and we thank you for your cooperation to date. *Parish Covid Officer.*
